### **Post-Inspection Update: ICT Observation Feedback**

As you know I carried out classroom observations in January in all classes. The focus of the observations was the integration of ICT across the curriculum. The findings were very positive with the areas of strength being a wide range of ICT resources being used across the school: iPads, apps including Explain Everything, Puppet Pals, Book Creator, Green Screen, BeeBots, laptops, IWB, teacher use of apps to enhance lesson starters/openings. There is a clear development of thinking skills and personal capabilities through ICT: pupils working together, managing information, problem solving. Pupils are talking about algorithms, debugging, programming, coding and are clearly engaged in the lessons.
