#### <u>Celebration of the Sacraments for Primary 3,</u> <u>Primary 4 and Primary 7</u>

We are looking forward to celebrating the sacraments of First Confession, First Communion and Confirmation with our Primary 3, Primary 4 and Primary 7 pupils.

#### Primary 3: First Confession

First Confession will take place on <u>Wednesday 21</u> <u>March at 10.45am</u> in St. Patrick's Chapel.

In preparation for receiving this sacrament parents are invited to come along to to a **Commitment Service on Thursday 1 March at 11am.** This will take place in the school assembly hall and teachers will share important details about First Confession with you then.

#### Primary 4: First Communion

First Communion takes place on Saturady 12 May at 10am in St. Patrick's Chapel. Primary 4 will prepare for receiving the Sacrament of th Eucharist by participating in a 'Breaking of Bread' Service on Wednesday 18 April at 11am in the school assembly hall. Parents are invited along to this service and teachers will share important information about First Communion Day as well.

#### Primary 7: Confirmation

## Confirmation for Primary 7 pupils will take place on **Friday 9 March at 11am in St. Patrick's Chapel.**

In preparation for making their Confirmation parents are invited to our 'Service of Light' on Tuesday 27 February at 7pm. Important information about Confirmation will be shared with parents then.

#### Primary 1 Enrolment for September 2018

Parents are reminded that the closing date for applications for **Primary 1 enrolment in September 2018 is this Wednesday 10 January at 12noon.** Application forms along with birth certificates must be handed into the school office before this time, otherwise they will be treated as late applications.

#### **Sporting Activities**

**Primary 3** have 2 more sessions at tennis this term to make up for missed sessions last term. These will take place on Wednesday 10 and Wednesday 17 January.

**Primary 5** begin tennis on Wednesday 24 January and will have 6 sessions. These sessions cost  $\pounds 2$  each so  $\pounds 12$  for all 6 which can be paid in full.

**Primary 6** begin badminton at Lisburn Racquets' Club on Friday 12 January. They will have 8 sessions in all and the cost of each session is  $\pounds 2$  so  $\pounds 16$  in total.

**Primary** 7 begin swimming. The cost of each session is  $\pounds 2.20$  so all 10 sessions cost  $\pounds 22$ . It would be very helpful if the  $\pounds 22$  could be paid in full at the start of January.

Parents are reminded that girls must wear a one piece swimming costume.

Due to time constraints it is not possible for pupils to have a shower after swimming and the use of aerosols is strictly prohibited.

Pupils can wear their school PE Kit to school on these days but I would remind you that the PE kit consists of plain navy bottoms or the school PE trousers. Other trousers with stripes, logos etc are NOT permitted.

#### A big thank you!

As you know our annual fundraising culminated in the handing over of £3400 to a number of charities at our annual Carol Concert in December. Thank you so much to all of our families who have supported our charity fundraising across the year.

#### Shared Education with Harmony Hill Primary School

We are delighted to begin a new Shared Education project with Harmony Hill this term. Both schools will be working on shared Literacy resources with Primary 7 and Primary 3 pupils working together later in the year.

Mrs O'Hare and Mrs Hanna will be working with Harmony Hill teachers in the week beginning Monday 15 January so we will have further details to share with you then.

#### **Post-Inspection Update**

Our school improvement journey continues this term with staff training in Mathematics and ICT.

In December Miss Clarke our mathematics coordinator carried out pupil voice sessions with representative pupils from each class. These sessions were based on word problems which we have been developing this year. She carried out word problems with the pupils and was able to video their approaches to a variety of word problems. All in all, she was very pleased with the pupil understanding of the variety of word problems and their approaches to solving these.

Jill Garland our district ETI inspector will visit the school this Thursday to carry out joint lesson observations with Mrs Hanna, our Literacy Coordinator. This is another step in the journey towards our follow-up ETI inspection which will happen at some point either this term or early in the second term. As a whole school community we are very much looking forward to having our follow-up ETI inspection.

#### **Mid-Term Break**

#### **Assessment for Learning**

As part of our on-going school improvement journey teachers have been trialling a variety of ways of 'marking for improvement.' Marking for improvement is marking pupils' work effectively so that they can make improvements to that particular piece and to future work. We have agreed to use the technique of 'yellow box marking' to develop marking for improvement in Literacy and Numeracy this term.

Teachers will highlight aspects of work that can be improved in a yellow box and pupils will have the opportunity to improve these.

As part of our commitment to improved communications with you as parents we will be using the SeeSaw app to share examples of 'yellow box' marking with you in the month of January. Look out for these!

#### Value of the Month

Our "Value of the Month" for January is DILIGENCE. This is an extremely suitable value for January as it encourages us to stick at something be it a new year's resolution, our school work etc. Teachers will be looking out for pupils who have shown diligence in school life and have made sure they have been able to see a task through to the end.
