Digital Admissions

The Education Authority (EA) are introducing a new digital admissions procedure for applications to Primary 1 in September 2019. Parents will apply through a **Parent Portal**: A new portal for parents to apply online for a place, including the listing of preferences.

The new Digital Admissions process will go live on Wednesday 2 January at 10am and will close at 12 midnight on Thursday 31 January 2019. Parents will have the opportunity to amend their submitted application until the closing date. This replaces the current paper-based application form.

The EA is planning to provide Assisted Digital Support for parents and users of the new system. This will be in the form of a new telephone service, enhanced website content and several face to face drop-in clinics held in EA offices and other locations during January 2019. Details of the planned digital assistance will be provided in due course.

Shared Education

Our shared education partnership with Harmony Hill Primary School enters its 2nd year of funding this year. This is a superb opportunity for teacher training and sharing good practice with staff from Harmony Hill.

Over the next few months, children will work together sharing work digitally using the online courses on our virtual learning environment **Fronter**. Miss Clarke and Miss Holmes from Harmony Hill have been working together to set up rooms based on our topics. Children will be able to exchange their work and take part in online discussions with other children in their school year.

Teachers will also meet to plan the shared contact days - children will take part in a range of activities to enhance learning and teaching in both schools. Teachers from Harmony Hill and St. Joseph's took part in CCEA Communication training on 15th October. The training was led by Mrs Fleming and Mrs Hanna for all teachers from both schools. Over the next number of weeks teaching staff will be working with the staff from Harmony Hill to build a portfolio of children's work for internal moderation. We will keep you up to date with any news.



POTTERY STUDIO SESSIONS

Pottery workshops continue in the Island Arts Centre with Mr Reid's P5 class and Miss Awada's P2 class.

Each class will have three sessions during November working with real clay that will be fired in a kiln. We are one of few primary schools in Northern Ireland that offer this facility. The children love their experiences working with clay and are learning valuable transferable Skills.
