
Reading Strategies

Problem Solving in the Foundation Stage

- We emphasise 'open' challenges where children have some information and an end goal but can achieve this in a variety of ways i.e. How could we make the scales balance?
- Children are encouraged to choose, reason, make decisions and discuss their thinking.
- > Trial and error problem solving encourages resilience and risk taking!
- > Variety of practical problems and word (language based) problems.

- What is the problem?
- How are you going to solve it?

Outdoor Learning


- This year the entire school is focusing on making the most of our surroundings and taking learning out of the classroom and into nature!
