At this time, we still plan to host our 'Induction Day' for new primary one children in June and will announce this date closer to the time. Update on each Year group

P7

Primary Seven continue to work really hard and most importantly, independently using Google Classroom. This week the children completed CCEA numeracy tasks. Great work, well done everyone! The children also worked on angles and revised activities using protractors. Within literacy, the children started a unit of work on War poetry, learning about famous War poets like Wilfred Owen. The children also carried out a series of poetry related tasks. PDMU and our Friday discussions are still a success! We are continuing with our novel 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas', daily mental maths and weekly spellings. The children are all working hard and we hope that they are finding the work enjoyable.

P6

Primary 6 have returned to home schooling in Term 3 with their usual enthusiasm and positivity. They are using a combination of SeeSaw and email to follow their home learning journey. Mrs Gartland and Mrs Fleming are creating curriculum area help sheets to take them through new learning as well as sending them 'Explain Everything' videos as support. They are really enjoying their class novels 'Journey to the River Sea' and 'Letters from the Lighthouse'. They are also very excited about their new topic 'Titanic' which we will be starting next week. Well done Primary 6 on adapting so well to your remote learning! P5

Mrs Gorman and Ms Kitt are really happy with how the Primary 5 classes are progressing. This week the children were enjoying the challenge of fractions (We also think the parents might have enjoyed these challenges too!). Although we are coming to the end of our class novels, we have more learning to achieve through these. Our projects on 'The Human Body' are progressing nicely; we are all learning some weird and wonderful facts! We are receiving such supportive comments from our parents and we are really enjoying the updates the children are sending us on Fronter and SeeSaw!

P4

Term 3 has seen Primary Four begin their new topic on 'minibeasts' which has sparked a lot of interest from the children! The great weather has allowed the children to get busy in their gardens carrying out minibeast hunts and gathering things they need to make their bug hotels. The minibeast Fronter room which has been set up also, provides a great opportunity





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to develop their research skills and learn lots of interesting facts! We have started our Primary Four 'home learning page' and our literacy and numeracy tasks are there for parents to download and print. Children have been completing these very well and posting to our class journals and on SeeSaw. This has been a great way to interact with the children and we can both see enhanced motivation. It also gives the children access to a range of activities (written and audio) which we can assign to them, they complete and we can respond too! Additional pupils have been added to Lexia also and pupils have been making a good effort to keep their Mathletics work on track too! AQE Updates

Latest information from the AQE website from Wednesday 22nd April.

"This is a very uncertain time for everyone involved in education, not least for parents and pupils. AQE is endeavouring to provide clarity to P6 pupils and parents about the arrangements for the tests which are scheduled to take place during the next academic year. Registration is due to open on Wednesday 29th April for applications from parents of P6 children who will sit the AQE assessments in Autumn. AQE Limited is having ongoing discussions with key stakeholders to ensure that the best possible provision is made for applicants and, for this reason, the date of registration opening may be slightly delayed. Due to the circumstances caused by the continuing disruption of lockdown, AQE is moving completely to an online application process this year. It is hoped that the process will simplify the application procedure and will enable parents to upload electronic photographs, scanned birth certificates and pay online. Detailed information can be found on the 'Registration Section'. The online form will go live on the date registration opens'.

AQE/PPTCNI have written to the Minister of Education, Mr Peter Weir, to ask for a delay in the AQE/GL assessments scheduled for the Autumn Term. Any changes will be communicated to you as soon as we have them. Please remember it is really important to register as early as possible, especially if you would like you child to sit their examinations in a certain school.

TIP Both boys and girls can sit AQE and GL exams in Hunterhouse and Victoria College. This can make life easier for both pupils and parents when it comes to sitting the exams. However, their places fill up very quickly so you must have your registration forms returned early.
