As you know Mr Murray was successful in the recruitment for the Principal position at St. Mary's Primary School Newcastle and takes up this post on 12<sup>th</sup> June; we wish Mr Murray the very best of luck and thank him for the contribution he has made to St. Joseph's.

The Council for Catholic Maintained Schools (CCMS) has suspended the recruitment process due to Covid-19; and until this process can be recommenced, I can advise that **Mr Barry McMahon** will take up the post of Acting Principal from 12<sup>th</sup> June. I would like to extend a warm welcome to Mr McMahon and wish him well in leading St. Joseph's and working closely with the Senior Leadership Team at the school.

#### **Annual Reports**

- Attendance will not be reported on this year.
- Reports will be posted out to parents on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> June.
