Reopening plans

P5

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their homes and really trying to zap their tables! The children have really impressed us with their artwork, sports activities and other hobbies which they love to share! We are so proud of everything they are achieving!

Yet another great week of home learning in P3! This week the children continued their topic on Animals. We used the website links on our Animal page on Fronter to help us research our favourite animal and then we wrote a report on the animal that we had chosen - super work! They also completed the CCEA task 'Alien Puppets' which allowed them to apply lots of the maths knowledge that they have learnt this year! Finally we had a bit of fun on SeeSaw this week with the activity 'Ahhhh there's a teacher in my house!' The children in P2 have had another successful week of home learning...so many activities completed!
