The British Transplant Games (BTG) have been staged annually since 1978 in 17 host cities across the UK. The BTG aim to demonstrate the benefits of transplantation, encouraging transplant patients to regain fitness, whilst increasing public awareness of the need for more people to join the NHS Organ Donation Register and discuss their wishes with their families. They also seek to thank and celebrate donor families and the gift of life. Lucyellen had a transplant in 2014, when she was 7 months old. This year will be Lucyellen's third year participating in the BTG, which will be held in Coventry. There are already over 1000 people, who have received a lifesaving transplant, registered to compete in the BTG in July. Participants are expected to fundraise as the games receive no central funding. Lucyellen is so excited to see her friends and make new ones, while competing in the BTG. Thank you to everyone for supporting Lucyellen. The amount of £420, raised from our 'wear red' day on the 14th February, will be presented to Lucyellen and her family.
